Just spent the last two days with The Positive Ponies from Hens for Hire Ltd and what a fabulous two days it was too.

Day one was in a preschool in Derby and day two in a 'Flexi Schooling' setting in Chesire.

Flexi-Schooling is an arrangement between the parent/guardian and a school, whereby children are registered at the school in the usual way but only attend for part of the week. The main days in school tend to be focused on Tuesday to Thursday with students being home educated on the other two days. Thinking back to all the young folk whom I have worked with over the years and how this would have been so good for them in primary education. This school was incredible, so inspirational, a credit to the head teacher and her team. At a time when mental health is at an all time high how education is delivered could do with being more flexible overall to meet the needs of our young folk. No easy task I know given the demands and shortage of funding but adaptations and thinking outside the box are possible as seen yesterday.

On Thursday we also had Cheshire Dance in with us running a Ukrainian Dance Workshop with our Oaks in the morning and Acorns in the Afternoon. The children loved it and got so much from it. Olena is from the Mykolaiv region in the South of Ukraine. She has been dancing for over 15 years and has performed over the world. She came to the UK 9 months ago and is passionate about sharing her culture, traditions and movement from her county. She met me at the end of the day and said how wonderful our children had been and how impressed she was in the school. She also said the same to Miss Jen as she left!

Tuesday saw our reports go out. I cannot believe that another academic year that has passed by. The reports were amazing. It was such a joy to read through them all and see what achievements the children have made. The progress across school is exceptional. Tuesday also saw our SATs results which were amazing. As a school we gained 75% expected in both Reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (the national average for these was 73% and 72%) and 62.5% in our writing and maths. What blew me away was the level of children gaining higher standard in Reading-50% higher standard. This was the paper that hit the news for how hard it was and how stressful some children found it! I could not be prouder of all of our children, no matter what results they got, the way they handled them and completed them with such tenacity was amazing! And for this I am super proud.

Next week, will be an emotional one. Our Year 6's will sadly be flying the Huxley Nest. We would love to welcome you all to their leavers assembly on Wednesday at 1.30pm. Please can you let Miss Lloyd know if you intend to come just so we have enough chairs and refreshments available. The Year 6's have been working hard on their leavers video – my office is covered in wig hair and props!
