### What a week...

...but we got there. Thanks for your understanding with regard to the COVID cases. When I wrote this last night I stated that I was pleased to say that it was an isolated case on Monday but we now have had a second case today. It shows how quickly things change! On the advice of Public Health, we continue as normal but I have sent out a letter today with further advice for you to refer to. Thank you for those who went for tests and got the results back to us so quickly and for those that keep us informed of absence etc- we really appreciate it.

In school, all remains the same, the same handwashing and precautions where needed, but the children do not know any differently which is just how we wanted it to be. The situation has been so strange for them over the last 18 months and we just want to keep our little Huxley bubble happy, carefree and having fun whilst obviously keeping safe. Should there be any changes to any guidance or case numbers, I will immediately inform you.

In school this week, the well was revealed- it was so fascinating for the children- they could not believe how deep it was! More historical enquiry took place in Oaks as they found out about historical events in Huxley and they also created timelines of historical events. In Acorns they looked at the old buildings in Huxley and discussed how they knew whether a building was old or modern; discussing building materials and features of the buildings as they walked by.

Unfortunately, as you know the parent's session had to be cancelled- what I am going to do is send out a loom video tomorrow- this is the presentation I was going to share with you but with my voiceover (sorry!) I just feel that this information needs sharing. I did really want you to meet the team too and hear from them so we will still, at some point, meet but for now at least you can get the information.
