Did you know ...?

Free School meals

Your child may be entitled to receive free school meals if you are entitled to receive one of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190.
- Universal Credit (Provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400)

In the summer I made a sketchpad for every child- see the pictures below of how they are looking for our full timers- they're great aren't they!

In Showbie I have added another folder which is just for the timetables and overviews so you can see what lessons the full time children are doing on Monday and Fridays on a rotation. We have been uploading these lessons too so you see what we have been up to should you wish to tie in any of your home learning activities.

Finally, also included in the email alongside this newsletter is a communications flowchart. I am sure that you can appreciate that as headteacher I receive an awful lot of emails each day and sometimes these will arrive when I am in meetings or with children. These emails can sometimes be answered by other members of staff more effectively and quickly- especially if it is to do with classroom or admin matters so hopefully this flow chart will help direct you to the best person to deal with any queries or concerns. I am always out on the playground at the start and end of the day too and *my door is always open*, I am just trying to tighten up on some day to day running of the school to help us work more efficiently as a team.
